## DRAG LAB

Kendal Pride initiative Drag Lab took six aspiring performers on a six-month journey of drag discovery under the tutelage of Sally Lofthouse-Jones (drag king Andi Blewitt), culminating in a sell-out performance at The Box. We spoke to Drag Lab participant Lou Mather, aka bumblebee Bufftail Carpenter

**Before Drag Lab, I had done some tiny bits of drag-like performances,** but I'd never put much thought or time into it before. I signed up to Drag Lab because I thought it would be a great opportunity to put some deliberate time into developing an act of my own, and getting a chance to play with performance in a way I hadn't before.

**For me, drag is about creating space to be the biggest, silliest, and most joyful version of myself.** I wanted my drag to explore the inherent queerness of nature, and to weave a line between being sweet, silly, and slutty - I'm a big believer that sexuality doesn't need to be serious, and drag is a great space to play with that! Bufftail was a way to bring ecology, comedy and queerness together for a performance - plus there's something inherently queer and trans about a masc-presenting worker bee, as workers are always female, so that really spoke to me as a non-binary person.

**The first month of the project was incredible** - going from blank drawing board, to first scratch night with props, costume, sound and a fun act, all in the space of a month. I spent many late nights crafting at RagTag with Josh or dancing around my bedroom with a huge cardboard flower and had so much fun!

**After the first scratch night, maintaining the focus was definitely a challenge,** but really worth it for the final showcase and seeing everyone's fantastic acts come together!

**I have vague plans for a new character exploring the theme of queer nature from a different angle,** and hopefully one day I'd like to weave several different characters together

into a queer woodland cabaret, but for now I'm focusing on organising Bal-Curious (my balfolk festival running 6-8th June) and managing the chaos that comes with summer working in the outdoors. I'll return to drag in the autumn!

**I'm so grateful to Kendal Pride for all the amazing opportunities they create, and the gorgeous ways they bring people together** - and I love how the festival-like structure of our Pride weekend creates space for so many different ways to meet people and share joy beyond the usual parades and parties. Thanks for everything Pride is doing to make Kendal such a joyful place to be queer!

## QUEER HISTORY

Neil Whalley looks back at nearly 2,000 years of queer history in Cumbria

Cumbria has a surprising amount of LGBTQIA+ history when you start to look. Almost 2,000 years ago the Romans arrived here, bringing some acceptance of homosexuality and eunuch priests in female clothes called *galli*. Romans later introduced Christianity and the idea of homosexuality as sin.

We don't know how much the church's teachings affected ordinary queer people during the Middle Ages but attitudes to sin and gender roles got stricter from the 1100s. Henry VIII made homosexuality illegal in 1533 but trials were rare. Thomas Kellett, who was pilloried in Penrith in 1811, was one of the first known in Cumbria. Other queer men were occasionally imprisoned or transported during the 1800s and

1900s until the law was changed in 1967 (thanks in part to queer Cumbrian EB Ford). In the decade before this, scores of men were arrested

for gross indecency in Kendal, Barrow, Carlisle and Keswick.

Cumbria has produced its fair share of pioneering queer women like festival organiser Mary Wakefield, linguist Elsie Butler, golfer Cecil Leitch and activist Beatrix Campbell. Others, like radical feminist Dora Marsden and Maureen Colquhoun, Britain's first openly lesbian MP, found refuge here in later life. Alston attracted a small but thriving lesbian community during the 1980s.

Cumbrians weren't afraid to challenge gender binaries. Whitehaven mine worker Sal Madge was well-loved locally for her 'masculine' dress, pipe smoking and sporting prowess.

Writer Eliza Lynn Linton penned her autobiography in the guise of a man (possibly to disguise lesbian affairs), while gender-critical writer Thomas Baty wrote under the name Irene Clyde. Kendal's own Herbert Pollitt performed in drag as Diane de Rougy and male impersonators were popular in

Cumbrian music halls from the 1860s to WWI. In the 1980s, Workington artist Percy Kelly began their social transition to Roberta.

Since the 1970s, queerness has slowly become more visible and accepted in Cumbria, beginning with the foundation of campaigning groups like the CHE, gay switchboard and later OutREACH Cumbria. Carlisle hosted Cumbria's first Pride in 2009 and there are now events in Barrow, Whitehaven, Silloth, Ulverston and, of course, Kendal.

As we face increased threats of intolerance and injustice today, it's important to recognise our history and those who helped us get where we are. They show we've always been here and we're not going anywhere.

# PRIDE CHAT WITH... VIOLA

Kendal Pride's main stage host tells all about RuPaul's Drag Race, her hidden talent and the importance of local Prides

## Welcome back to Kendal Pride!

I'm sooo so excited to be back! I adored Pride last year, especially the range of acts we had performing. Musicians, dancers, singers and... dogs! Only in Kendal! It really was a celebration of all Kendal has to offer and I'm honoured to be hosting another year of Kendal Pride.

## What was the first Pride you attended?

My first Pride was in my hometown Coventry in 2016, the year I came out. I will remember that day forever as it was the first time I realised I was part of a community much bigger and more accepting than I could have imagined.

I was overwhelmed with a sense of pride for myself and for others, and felt a deep gratitude for the historical queer trailblazers who are the reason we can have Pride now. That unbreakable feeling is why I became a drag queen – to be a role model for whoever I can reach in drag.

## Big city Pride or local Pride?

I love a big city Pride for the nightlife, but I prefer a local Pride for the sense of community. Local Prides are more important because there's less access to queer spaces in

smaller towns. They remind us that Pride began locally; in small communities, people finding each other, coming together and uplifting one another.

## You are a virtuoso violin player. Do you have any secret strings to your bow?

I'm actually a better flautist than violinist, but I don't play the flute at my gigs as I find it really tricky to get a clean sound with my lippy on! But feel free to scroll down my Instagram Reels to see footage of 'Viola the Flautist'.

## What do you think RuPaul would make of Kendal?

I'm sure Ru would adore the ferocious and noisy community of Kendal and smile at seeing the joy bursting from everyone.

## Kendal Pride, Drag Race... the world? What's next for Viola?

I will be performing at local and city Prides, weekly on Manchester's Canal Street and all round the UK with my solo cabaret show. And next spring I'll be touring the UK once again with 'Dragged to the Musicals!'

## SHE DREW THE GUN

The Merseyside artist talks protest, Pride and escaping hetero-mundanity

**Pride to me is a celebration of queer culture, being out and about and visible in solidarity together.** A community that has historically been silenced and pushed underground creating a joyful, visible intersection of party and protest. Welcoming whoever wants to be part of it!

**It's hard to imagine a local hometown Pride back in the day.** I'm from a town in the Wirral and I really don't think there was much visible queerness for a young person. I started going to gay clubs when I was a teenager and always just felt like it was such a safe space to be in, to be yourself, wear whatever you want, play with gender and kind of escape boring hetero-mundanity. I'm not sure my hometown was ready for that in the late 90's but I think it would have made me accept myself and my queerness sooner if it was.

**I usually go to Liverpool Pride.** There's been a Wirral Pride since 2022 but I haven't made it to that yet so I'm a local Pride newbie. There are lots of cool, smaller, unofficial Pride events that go on around the city, which are probably the best part!

**I think my first Pride was London Pride sometime in the late noughties.** It just felt like such a big event, seeing so many people out in the streets. I remember being surprised to

see all the counter-protesters with religious placards calling us sinners. We were definitely having a lot more fun than them.

**I think of my music almost as diary entries so they are little snapshots of where I am in life.** I think the observational

part is always informed by my queerness, feminism and anti-capitalist perspective. I think the best art is often saying something to you that disrupts the usual flow of the status quo and I try to find ways to do that in ways that interest me wherever I can.

**Like Pride, I suppose a She Drew the Gun concert is a bit of a party and a protest at the same time.** Musically it's a bit of a melting pot, a bit psychedelic, a bit punk flavoured with a few electronic bangers, lots of spoken word and lyrically subverting the endorsed world order. I think one of the things you will get at a She Drew the Gun concert is a room full of lovely like-minded people!
